#### What to do next...

#### Either:

Write a letter to the company.

Explain who you are and what you would like to do and give details of why and when.

#### Or:

Fing and ask to speak to Manager / HR Department.

#### Then:

- Take / send WEX Employer form to placement for completion.

### What happens next

- All placements are contacted/visited and a placement assessment / health and safety check is completed.
  - (This is why we ask for the forms back at the beginning of December.)
- An agreement is drawn up and sent to employer and parents with details of placement.
  - (To be signed and returned to WEX team before the start of work experience.)
- Students are visited or receive a phone call by a member of staff during Work Experience.



#### Take Note!

The company / firm / organisation you are applying to MUST have Employer Liability Insurance.

If they don't, you cannot work with them.

Please ask Mrs Stawman, in the WEX office, if you are unsure.

#### December Deadline

- ♥ Please ensure that you return both the completed Student and Employer forms by Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2019.
- Use the October Half Term holiday to contact / visit and secure a placement.
