THE HOUSE SYSTEM



At Warlingham School & Sixth Form College, our well-established house system, which was started in 2004, eases your transition. It provides a sense of belonging to a smaller community of the school (approximately 300 students per house) with its own unique ethos and uniform. Siblings join the same house so as to create familiarity for younger brothers and sisters.

Warlingham has four Houses: Chichester, Johnson, Mallory and Sharman. Named after renowned adventurers, each house has its own Head and Deputy Head of House, Form Tutors, support staff and house colour. In Year 7, students are allocated to a form within their house which is overseen by a Form Tutor. This tutor will remain with you throughout your school life. Upon joining their house, students are soon involved in a variety of events and activities during which they can earn House Points, not only for their own benefit but for the benefit of the House too.

The house year culminates in a sporting finale, Sports Day, during which students compete against their competitor houses in a variety of sporting activities. 



CATERING

We have a contract with a company called *Twelve15* to provide our school meals service. The canteen is open before school from 8.15am for breakfast and at break and lunchtime.

A variety of food is available each day ranging from sandwiches and wraps, to pasta and curry dishes, salad pots, paninis, fruit, cakes and biscuits plus a selection of healthy drinks. A 'main meal' of the day is always available at lunchtime.

Food is cooked on the school premises and meets current school meal regulations with particular care taken regarding fat, salt and sugar content. In December 2021, our canteen achieved the highest rating (5) for Food Safety & Hygiene by Tandridge District Council.

Twelve15 is fully compliant to the requirements of Natasha's Law which became legislation on 1 October 2021 and caters for 14 recognised food allergens, including celery, crustaceans, dairy, egg, fish, gluten, lupin, molluscs, mustard, nut, peanut, sesame, soya and sulphites. They also support vegetarian, vegan and pork and beef free diets. For more information, please consult the Head of Catering, Mrs Rowell.
