Student Dress Expectations during Activities Week

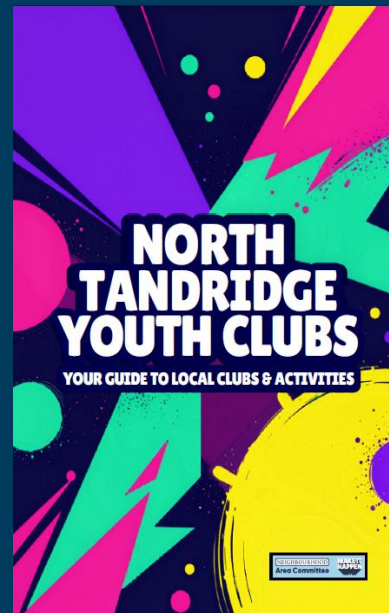
