General Information

- Bring your A-Game to every exam, no matter how big or small do your best!
- Don't be late!
- Go to the toilet before you go into the exam hall.
- Check your seating carefully for each exam.
- Be considerate about others around the school. Just because you've finished, doesn't mean others have.
- Enter <u>and</u> leave the sports building in silence.

Good Exam practice

- Student must only bring the things that they need for their exam in a clear plastic bag or clear pencil case it is up to them to be responsible for bringing the correct equipment. (for instance: If they forget a ruler or calculator, there will be none to lend and this may impact on their ability to do as well in the exam).
- Water bottles are allowed but these must be clear (not opaque) with no labels.
- Bags, coats, phones and any other electronic items must be left in a locker or in the designated areas around the school.
- Do not bring phones or any non-exam items anywhere near the Exam Hall or room.
- Some analogue watches are allowed on desks. No digital or smart watches. Watches may not be permitted by the invigilator/exams staff/SLT who have the final say on what is acceptable.

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Seating arrangements

• Students must sit in the allocated seat and room and must comply with any late seating changes made by staff.

Malpractice

- Students must follow the instructions of the invigilator.
- No communicating with other students inside the hall (which includes talking, turning around, making eye contact non verbally with other students, making distracting sounds or disturbing others etc.)
- No phones or authorised items in the exam hall.

The steps taken as a result of malpractice could impact severely on a student's ability to take exams at Warlingham School so this must be taken seriously.
