Students must collect their results in person unless they have emailed [exams@warlinghamtl.co.uk](mailto:exams@warlinghamtl.co.uk) from their **school email address** to nominate a third party to collect on their behalf. Please arrange this in advance.

Please note that the results collected in August are not the official certificates, which will be available for collection at a later date; further details will be provided.

Staff will be available to discuss and support students with their results, and results packs will include clear guidance on how to check papers and request re-marks if needed.
